What is this product?

TYPE OF PRODUCT

The product is a sub-fund of DECALIA SICAV, an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

TERM

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However, the board of directors may decide to close this product under certain circumstances.

OBJECTIVES

Objectives and investment policy

The Sub-Fund's investment objective is to seek an attractive long term rate of return on European stock markets by investing predominantly its assets in companies that will, based on the investment manager's opinion, structurally benefit from ageing, population such as, for example, financial savings, medical equipment, healthcare, leisure, pharmaceuticals, dependency services, household & personal care, auto manufacturers.

The Sub-Fund will invest at least 75% of its net assets in equities and equity related securities (such as depositary receipts, closed-ended Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITS)) of companies that benefit from ageing population, domiciled and/or headquartered in Europe.

There will be no restriction in terms of geographical exposure (except a maximum of 20% of the Sub-Fund's net assets in emerging countries), currencies in which investments will be denominated. However, depending on financial market conditions, a particular focus can be placed in a single country (or some countries) and/or in a single currency and/or in a single economic sector.

Within a maximum of 25% of its net assets, the Sub-Fund may invest in any other type of eligible assets such as equities and equity related securities from other geographical areas, money market instruments, debt securities (including convertible securities), undertakings for collective investment (UCIs) and cash.

However, the Sub-Fund may invest directly in the assets listed below, subject to the following constraints:

- Maximum 10% of its net assets in UCIs.
- Maximum 10% of its net assets in closed-ended REITs.
- Debt securities (including money market instruments) or issuers considered as investment grade.
- Maximum 10% of its net assets in SPACs (Special Purpose Acquisition Companies).
- Maximum 10% of its net assets in China A-shares, via the use of the Stock Connect markets.
- Maximum 10% of its net assets in structured products (other than convertible bond type instruments), such as but not limited to certificates or any other transferable securities whose returns are correlated with changes in, among others, transferable securities (equities or debt securities) or a basket of transferable securities, commodities.

If the investment manager considers this to be in the best interest of the shareholders, on a temporary basis and for defensive purposes, the Sub-Fund may also, hold, up to 100% of its net assets, cash and cash equivalents.

Derivatives For hedging and for any other purposes, the Sub-Fund may use all types of financial derivative instruments traded on a regulated market and/or over-the-counter.

Benchmark The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The index MSCI Europe Net Return Index is only used for the calculation of the performance fee (payable to the investment manager) and for performance comparison purposes. The Sub-Fund does not track the index and can deviate significantly or entirely from the index.

ESG information The Sub-Fund is categorized as a financial product falling under the scope of **article 8** of the **SFDR**. The investment manager integrates sustainability risks and opportunities into its research, analysis and investment decision-making processes. The Sub-Fund is managed to promote, among other characteristics, a combination of environmental and social characteristics (as provided under article 8 of SFDR). The investment manager also incorporates and evaluates governance factors in the investment decision-making processe.

Dividend Policy This Class is cumulative. Dividend distributions are not planned.

Share Class Currency The currency of the Class is CHF.

The recommended holding period of this product is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and avoiding short term market fluctuations.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (the "NAV") calculated by FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. (the "Administrative Agent"). This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

INTENDED RETAIL INVESTORS

The product is suitable for retail investors with limited knowledge of the underlying financial instruments and no financial industry experience. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

For any subscription or redemption request received by the Fund, prior to 12:00 p.m. Luxembourg time, at the Valuation Day, the NAV calculated on the Calculation Day will be applicable.

Switching Shareholders may apply for any share of any sub-fund or class to be converted into shares of another sub-fund or class, provided that the conditions for accessing the target class, are fulfilled, on the basis of their respective NAV calculated on the Valuation Day following receipt of the conversion request. The redemption and subscription costs connected with the conversion may be charged to the shareholder as indicated in the prospectus. What happens if FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is not making any payment to you in relation to the Sub-Fund and you would still be paid in case of a default from the Management Company.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with a separate company, the Depositary, so the Sub-Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the insolvency of the Management Company. However, in the event of the Depositary's insolvency, or its delegates, the Sub-Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Sub-Fund. The Depositary will also be liable to the Sub-Fund or its investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfill its obligations (subject to certain limitations).

If the Sub-Fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment.

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Depositary.

What are the costs?
