Objectives and investment policy

The Fund's objective is to achieve a high income with the prospect of long term capital growth. The Fund will invest primarily in high yield bonds, investment grade bonds, government bonds, preference shares, convertible bonds and other bonds.

Convertible bonds are corporate bonds with an option that allows an investor to convert the bond into shares at a given price at specified times during the life of the convertible bond.

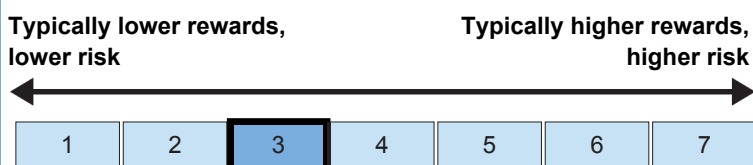
Any income arising in relation to this share class is distributed on a quarterly basis. By default this distribution will automatically be paid.

The Portfolio Manager is free to invest in any type of investment, without reference to a particular benchmark.

Investors are able to buy and sell shares during any business day. If you tell us to buy or sell shares before 1pm (Luxembourg time) on any business day we will make the transaction on the same day. If you tell us to buy or sell shares after 1pm (Luxembourg time) we will make the transaction on the following business day.

Risk and reward profile

The Risk and Reward Indicator table demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and reward. The higher the rank the greater the potential reward but the greater the risk of losing money. It is based on past data, may change over time and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The shaded area in the table below shows the Fund's ranking on the Risk and Reward Indicator.



- The lowest category does not mean 'no risk'. Some risk will still be present in funds with a risk and reward rating of 1.
- The Fund is in this category as it invests in a wide range of bonds issued by governments and companies, all of which carry some level of risk.
- You should note that there are risks to your money when investing, in particular:
 - Investments can fall in value. You may get back less than you invest;
 - Due to entry charges, you are less likely to see growth, or get back the amount invested, in the first few years;
 - The value of your money may be eroded by inflation;
 - Changes to currency exchange rates may cause the value of the Fund to fall, sometimes by a large amount, even if the shareclass is hedged against the main currency of the Fund.
- Bonds are very sensitive to interest rate changes and it is possible that bond issuers will not pay interest or return the capital promised. Bonds can also be 'downgraded' by rating agencies. All of these issues can reduce the value of bonds held by the Fund and therefore impact performance; and
- The Portfolio Manager can invest a significant portion of the Fund in high yield bonds (a type of bond which has a low or no rating from a credit rating agency) and non rated bonds. While such bonds may offer a higher income, the interest paid on them and their capital value is at greater risk, particularly during periods of changing market conditions. The level of income will change and is not guaranteed to remain constant.

Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.
