What is this product?

TYPE OF PRODUCT

The product is a sub-fund of MFM Funds (Lux), an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

IERM

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However, the Directors may decide to close this product under certain circumstances.

OBJECTIVES

Objectives and investment policy

This Sub-Fund aims to offer direct and indirect exposure to a wide range of asset classes: debt securities, equities and equity related securities (such as ADR (American Depositary Receipt), GDR (Global Depositary Receipt), EDR (European Depositary Receipt), certificates), cash, money market instruments, currencies, commodities and real estate.

The Sub-Fund may obtain its exposure:

- directly in the securities/asset classes mentioned in the previous paragraph (except for the commodities and real estate asset classes);
- in undertakings for collective investment (UCIs) having as main objective to invest in the above-mentioned asset classes;
- in any transferable securities (such as structured products) linked or offering an exposure to the performance of the above-mentioned asset classes;
- in financial derivative instruments having as underlying or offering an exposure to the above-mentioned asset classes;
- in closed-ended UCIs investing in property, especially Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) and similar investments.

In pursuing its investment policy and due to the use of financial derivative instruments, the Sub-Fund can invest, up to 100% of its net assets, term deposits, money market funds and money market instruments.

The choice of investments will neither be limited by geographical area, asset class and/or economic sector per in terms of currencies in which investments will be

The choice of investments will neither be limited by geographical area, asset class and/or economic sector nor in terms of currencies in which investments will be denominated. However, depending on financial market conditions, a particular focus can be placed on a single country (or some countries), a single currency, a single economic sector.

In case of opportunities, the Sub-Fund may be exposed up to 30% of its net assets in emerging markets.

The Sub-Fund may invest up to:

- 10% of its net assets in contingent convertible debt securities.
- 10% of its net assets in asset-backed/mortgaged-backed securities.
- 20% of its net assets in UCITS eligible alternative strategy funds.
- 20% of its net assets in closed-ended real estate UCIs, notably closed-ended REITs, closed-ended real estate investment funds and closed-ended real estate investment companies.
- 30% of its net assets in structured products, as detailed in the prospectus.

If the investment manager considers this to be in the best interest of the shareholders, on a temporary basis and for defensive purposes, the Sub-Fund may also hold up to 100% of its net assets in term deposits, money market UCIs and money market instruments.

Derivatives For hedging and for any other purposes, the Sub-Fund may use financial derivative instruments within the limits and descriptions set out in the prospectus. The use of derivative instrument may increase leverage, imply additional costs and risks.

Benchmark The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The Sub-Fund has no benchmark index and is not managed in reference to a benchmark index.

Dividend Policy This Class is cumulative. Dividend distributions are not planned.

Share Class Currency The currency of the Class is CHF.

The recommended holding period of this product is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and avoiding short term market fluctuations.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (the "NAV") calculated by FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. (the "Administrative Agent"). This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

INTENDED RETAIL INVESTORS

The product is reserved to investors through specific distributors selected by the Board of Directors. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

Asset segregation The assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law, which means that the performance of the assets in other sub-funds does not influence the performance of your investment.

Dealing The NAV for the Class is calculated on each bank business day in Luxembourg (the "Calculation Day"), on the basis of the prices as of the preceding business day (the "Valuation Day"). The cut-off time to submit subscriptions/redemptions orders is 12 noon Luxembourg time on the bank business day preceding the Valuation Day.

Switching Shareholders may apply for any share of any sub-fund to be converted into shares of another sub-fund, provided that the conditions for accessing the target class, type or sub-type, are fulfilled with respect to the Sub-Fund, on the basis of their respective NAV calculated on the Valuation Day following receipt of the conversion request. The redemption and subscription costs connected with the conversion may be charged to the shareholder as indicated in the prospectus. What happens if FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is not making any payment to you in relation to the Sub-Fund and you would still be paid in case of a default from the Management Company.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with a separate company, the Depositary, so the Sub-Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the insolvency of the Management Company. However, in the event of the Depositary's insolvency, or its delegates, the Sub-Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Sub-Fund. The Depositary will also be liable to the Sub-Fund or its investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfill its obligations (subject to certain limitations).

If the Sub-Fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment.

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Depositary.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
