Purpose

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

Global Dynamic Bond Fund (the 'Fund')

a sub-fund of Nomura Funds Ireland plc (the "Company")

This product is manufactured by Bridge Fund Management Ltd. The Fund is authorised in Ireland and is approved as an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities ("UCITS") by the Central Bank of Ireland. What is this product?

Type

Class I USD is a share class of the Fund, a sub-fund of the Company, which is an Irish UCITS variable capital umbrella investment company with segregated liability between sub-funds authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland.

Term

This product has no fixed term. The product may be liquidated under limited circumstances as detailed in the prospectus.

Objectives

Any income the Fund generates will be accumulated and reinvested on behalf of investors.

The Fund aims to achieve income and capital growth by investing primarily in a globally diversified portfolio of bonds (which are like loans that can pay a fixed or variable rate of interest).

The bonds are issued mainly by companies, governments and other financial institutions from around the world. Up to 30% of the Fund may be invested in bonds of companies, governments and other financial institutions issued in emerging markets. The investment manager has full discretion when deciding which investments should be held in the Fund but will primarily buy bonds that have been rated by at least one rating agency (Standard & Poors or Moody's). The Fund may purchase up to 30% of its Net Asset Value in unrated securities (which are not rated by a rating agency) if the investment manager determines that the security is of comparable quality to a rated security that the Fund may purchase. The Fund may use may use derivatives (bond futures, options on bond futures,

interest rate futures, credit default swaps ("CDS") and options on CDS, interest rate swaps and options on interest rate swaps, options on interest rate futures, inflation swaps, equity options (including options on exchange traded funds), equity index options, debt related total return swaps, currency forwards and FX options) for investment purposes, efficient portfolio management and/or hedging purposes, subject to the conditions and limits of the Central Bank of Ireland. Derivatives are linked to the rise and fall of other assets. In other words, they derive their price from another asset. They can generate returns when share prices and/or indices fall.

The Fund is actively managed without reference to any index meaning that the investment manager has full discretion over the composition of the fund's portfolio, subject to the stated investment objectives and policies of the fund.

Intended retail investor

The Fund is intended for retail and institutional investors. The Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

The Fund is suitable for investors seeking the potential for income and growth over time and can accept the risks associated with investments in fixed income securities as well as those associated with the enhanced use of derivative instruments.

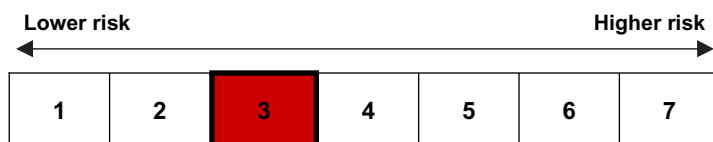
Other Information

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk Indicator

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.



The risk indicator (SRI) assumes you keep the product for a minimum of 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

We have classified this product as 3 out of 7, which is a medium-low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium-low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact the capacity of the Fund to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. If you choose a foreign currency share class you will be exposed to currency risk and your final return will depend on the exchange rate between the foreign currency and your local currency. Currency hedged share classes aim to deliver a return that is as close as possible to the base currency performance of a fund, by reducing the effect of exchange rate movements between the base currency and the hedged currency. However, these techniques may not be fully effective in completely removing the exchange rate risk.

Cost over time
