## What is this product?

### TYPE OF PRODUCT

The product is a sub-fund of Protea UCITS II, an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

### TERM

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However, the board of directors may also propose to dissolve a sub-fund at a General Meeting of that sub-fund.

### OBJECTIVES

#### Objectives and investment policy

The objective of PROTEA II FUND – MAGENTA MAM CONVICTIONS is to achieve capital appreciation by investing across various asset classes. The Sub-Fund's objective is to reach a 5% annual performance over a recommended investment horizon of at least five years. There can be no guarantee that the investment and/or performance objective of the Sub-Fund will be achieved.

In order to achieve its objective, the Sub-Fund will offer an active and opportunistic multi-asset allocation with a worldwide exposure to a variety of asset classes: equities and equity-related securities (including closed-ended (including Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs) and depositary receipts), debt securities of any type (including non-investment grade and unrated debt securities, inflation linked securities, convertible bonds and contingent convertible bonds, within the limits mentioned below), commodities (including precious metals) and money market instruments.

In order to achieve its objective, the Sub-Fund will mainly invest directly in the securities/asset classes mentioned above (except for commodities and precious metals), and/or in eligible undertakings for collective investment having as main objective to invest in the asset classes mentioned above, and/or in transferable securities (for example structured products) giving exposure to the asset classes mentioned above.

The Sub-Fund will invest within the following ranges of exposure:

- exposure to equities and equity-related securities will range between 0% and 60% of the Sub-Fund's net assets;
- exposure to debt securities of any type will range between 0% and 100% of the Sub-Fund's net assets. The Sub-Fund can be exposed to investment grade and non-investment grade debt securities;
- indirect exposure to commodities (including precious metals) will not exceed 20% of the net assets of the Sub-Fund;
- exposure to money market instruments will range between 0% and 100% of the Sub-Fund's net assets;
- the choice of investments will not be limited by the currency in which investments will be denominated; nevertheless, the Sub-Fund will have a maximum net exposure of 40% outside its reference currency;
- overall, the Sub-Fund's exposure to emerging market countries can represent up to 50% of its net assets.

The Sub-Fund does not use securities financing transactions SFT (Securities Financing Transactions) or TRS (Trade Repositories) which fall under the scope of SFDR (Securities Financing Transactions Regulation).

**Derivatives** For hedging and for investment purposes the Sub-Fund may use all types of financial derivative instruments traded on a regulated market and/or over-the-counter (OTC) derivatives provided they are contracted with leading financial institutions specialized in this type of transactions and subject to regulatory supervision. However, in normal market conditions, the Investment Manager intends to use contract for difference, options, futures and forward exchange contracts on currencies, interest rates, transferable securities and indices (including volatility indices).

**Benchmark** The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The Sub-Fund has no benchmark index and is not managed in reference to a benchmark index.

**Dividend Policy** This Class is cumulative. Dividend distributions are not planned.

**Share Class Currency** The currency of the Class is EUR.

The recommended holding period of this product is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and avoiding short term market fluctuations.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (the "NAV") calculated by FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. (the "Administrative Agent"). This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

### INTENDED RETAIL INVESTORS

The product is reserved for institutional investors. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

**Depositary** Bank Pictet & Cie (Europe) AG, succursale de Luxembourg (the "Depositary").

**Asset segregation** The assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law, which means that the performance of the assets in other sub-funds does not influence the performance of your investment.

**Dealing** The NAV for this Class is calculated on each Business Day (the “Calculation Day”), on the basis of the last available closing prices. For any subscription or redemption request received by the Fund, prior to 5 p.m. Luxembourg time, on the business day preceding the Calculation Day, the NAV calculated on the Calculation Day will be applicable.

**Switching** Shareholders may apply for any share of any sub-fund to be converted into shares of another sub-fund, provided that the conditions for accessing the target class, type or sub-type, are fulfilled with respect to this sub-fund, on the basis of their respective NAV calculated on the Valuation Day following receipt of the conversion request. The redemption and subscription costs connected with the conversion may be charged to the shareholder as indicated in the prospectus. ## What happens if FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is not making any payment to you in relation to the Sub-Fund and you would still be paid in case of a default from the Management Company.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with a separate company, the Depository, so the Sub-Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the insolvency of the Management Company. However, in the event of the Depository's insolvency, or its delegates, the Sub-Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depository is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Sub-Fund. The Depository will also be liable to the Sub-Fund or its investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfill its obligations (subject to certain limitations).

If the Sub-Fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment.

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Depository.

## What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

### Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
