Objectives and investment policy

Objective:

The fund aims to provide long term capital growth and income of 3 Month Euribor + 4.5% per annum before fees have been deducted* over a five to seven year period by investing in a diversified range of assets and markets worldwide. The fund aims to provide a volatility (a measure of how much the fund's returns may vary over a year) of up to two-thirds that of global equities over the same period.

Investment policy

The fund is actively managed and invests directly or indirectly through derivatives or open-ended investment funds and ETFs in a wide range of assets including equities, bonds and alternative asset classes.

The fund may invest in sub-investment grade bonds (being bonds with a credit rating below investment grade as measured by Standard & Poor's or any equivalent grade of other credit rating agencies).

The fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in asset-backed securities and mortgage-backed securities. The fund may invest indirectly in alternative asset classes such as commodities or real estate through derivatives, investment funds or structured securities.

The fund may use derivatives, long and short, with the aim of achieving investment gains, reducing risk or managing the fund more efficiently. The fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in open-ended investment funds (including other Schroder funds). The fund may invest in another fund that charges a performance fee. The fund may invest in money market investments and hold cash. The risk and reward indicator

Risk factors

ABS and MBS risk: The fund may invest in mortgage or asset-backed securities. The underlying borrowers of these securities may not be able to pay back the full amount that they owe, which may result in losses to the fund.

Sustainability risk: The fund has environmental and/or social characteristics. This means it may have limited exposure to some companies, industries or sectors and may forego certain investment opportunities, or dispose of certain holdings, that do not align with its sustainability criteria chosen by the investment manager. The fund may invest in companies that do not reflect the beliefs and values of any particular investor.

Credit risk: A decline in the financial health of an issuer could cause the value of its bonds to fall or become worthless.

Currency risk: The fund may lose value as a result of movements in foreign

exchange rates, otherwise known as currency rates.

Currency risk / hedged share class: The currency hedging of the share class may not be fully effective and residual currency exposure may remain. The cost associated with hedging may impact performance and potential gains may be more limited than for unhedged share classes.

Derivatives risk: Derivatives, which are financial instruments deriving their value from an underlying asset, may be used to manage the portfolio efficiently. The fund may also materially invest in derivatives including using short selling and leverage techniques with the aim of making a return. A derivative may not perform as expected, may create losses greater than the cost of the derivative and may result in losses to the fund.

Emerging Markets & Frontier risk: Emerging markets, and especially frontier markets, generally carry greater political, legal, counterparty, operational and liquidity risk than developed markets.

High yield bond risk: High yield bonds (normally lower rated or unrated) generally carry greater market, credit and liquidity risk meaning greater uncertainty of returns.

Liquidity risk: In difficult market conditions, the fund may not be able to sell a security for full value or at all. This could affect performance and could cause the fund to defer or suspend redemptions of its shares, meaning investors may not be able to have immediate access to their holdings.

Operational risk: Operational processes, including those related to the safekeeping of assets, may fail. This may result in losses to the fund.

Performance risk: Investment objectives express an intended result but there is no guarantee that such a result will be achieved. Depending on market conditions and the macro economic environment, investment objectives may become more difficult to achieve.


