The management company is Jupiter Asset Management International S.A. ("the Management Company").

Objectives and investment policy

The Fund's objective is to achieve long term capital growth.

The Fund will invest at least 70 per cent of its value in a global portfolio consisting of:
(i) shares and share related securities which may be issued by issuers located in any country and which the Investment Manager believes drive or benefit (or have the potential to drive or benefit) from financial innovation, including but not limited to payments technology, digital financial services, mobile banking and blockchain, and
(ii) financial derivative instruments. The fund will not invest in cryptocurrencies, however it can invest in companies which provide cryptocurrency-related services.

Benchmark Information

MSCI All Countries World Index Financials with net dividends re-invested

The Fund is actively managed and uses the benchmark for index performance comparison purposes only. This means the Investment Manager is taking investment decisions with the intention of achieving the Fund's investment objective without reference to a benchmark. The Investment Manager is not in any way constrained by a benchmark in its portfolio positioning.

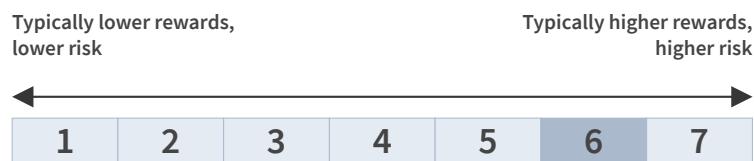
The Fund can use derivative instruments for investment purposes. Derivatives allow the Investment Manager to track changes in the price of an item, for example a company share, without actually owning it. Derivatives may be used to gain exposure to a number of different asset classes, including company shares, financial indices, commodities and currency exchange rates. The Fund may also use derivatives for hedging purposes.

Any income arising in relation to this share class will be accumulated (i.e. automatically reinvested and reflected in the price of the shares).

Investors are able to buy and sell shares during any business day. If you tell us to buy or sell shares before 1pm (Luxembourg time) on any business day we will make the transaction on the same day. If you tell us to buy or sell shares after 1pm (Luxembourg time) we will make the transaction on the following business day.

Risk and reward profile

The Risk and Reward Indicator table demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and reward. The higher the rank the greater the potential reward but the greater the risk of losing money. It is based on past data, may change over time and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The shaded area in the table below shows the Fund's ranking on the Risk and Reward Indicator.



- The lowest category does not mean 'no risk'.
- The Fund is in this category due to the nature of its investments and previous levels of volatility (how much the value of the Fund rises and falls).
- Market and exchange rate movements can cause the value of an investment to fall as well as rise, and you may get back less than originally invested, even if the share class is hedged against the main currency of the Fund.
- The Fund has the ability to use derivatives for investment purposes which under certain market conditions may cause the Fund to significantly fall in value. Investments in financial derivative instruments can introduce leverage risks which can amplify gains or losses in the Fund.
- There is a risk that any company providing services such as safe keeping of assets or acting as counterparty to derivatives may become insolvent, which may cause losses to the Fund.
- Gearing is a method used to increase the exposure of the portfolio to financials markets through the use of loans or derivatives. Gearing may lead to large and sudden movements in the value of the portfolio.
- The Fund invests into a specific market sector, its value may be subject to periods of high volatility falling and rising sharply over short periods of time.

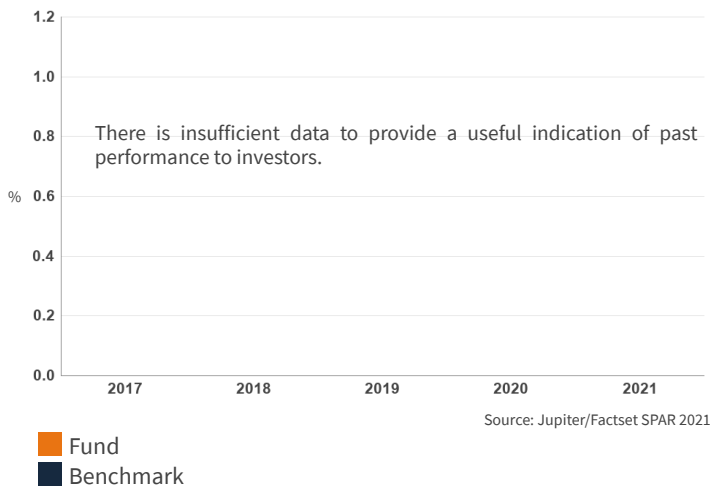
