What is this product?

The product is a sub-fund of Weisshorn Funds UCITS, an Undertaking for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities (UCITS) incorporated as a variable capital investment company (SICAV) under the laws of Luxembourg.

The Sub-Fund is established for an unlimited duration. However, the board of directors may also propose to dissolve a sub-fund at a General Meeting of that Compartment.

Objectives and investment policy

The investment objective of the Sub-Fund is to seek long-term capital growth and income by investing in a debt portfolio of fixed/floating income instruments, Money Market Instruments, cash and cash equivalents and collective investment schemes ("UCIS") pursuing traditional strategies and to a lesser extent alternative strategies UCITS eligible funds.

The investment manager will select debt securities or issuers to build a portfolio with an overall average credit quality of investment grade In order to reach its objective, the Sub-Fund will mainly invest in debt instruments (public and corporate issuers, short/long maturity bonds, fixed/variable rate securities, senior/subordinated debt, inflation-linked securities, perpetual bonds, investment grade/high yield bonds, convertible bonds), Money Market Instruments, cash and cash equivalents.

These investments may be obtained:

- directly in the securities/asset classes mentioned above; and/or
- in UCIs having as main objective to invest in the above-mentioned asset classes (within the below-mentioned 10% limit in UCITS and/or other UCIs).

The choice of investments will neither be limited by geographical area (including emerging markets), an economic sector, nor in a particular asset class, nor in currencies in which investments will be denominated. However, depending on financial market conditions, a particular focus can be placed in a single country and/or in a single economic sector and/or single asset class and/or in a single currency. On an ancillary basis, the Sub-Fund may invest in other eligible assets such as equity and equity related securities and UCIs (within the 10% limit above-mentioned).

To a lesser extent, the Sub-Fund may invest in structured products as defined in the prospectus.

All investments will be made in accordance with the provision set out under article 41 of the Law of 2010.

However, the Sub-Fund may invest directly in the assets listed below, subject to the following limits:

- Debt securities or issuers may have credit rating of all types (as detailed in prospectus)
- The Investment Manager may invest in contingent convertible bonds up to 10% of the net assets.
- Up to 10% of the net assets in UCITS and/or other UCIs (including UCITS eligible funds with alternative strategies ("equity long/short", "equity hedge", "relative value", "global macro", "event driven", ...)).

If the investment manager considers this to be in the best interest of the shareholders, on a temporary basis and for defensive purposes, the Sub-Fund may also hold, up to 100% of its net assets in liquidities, such as cash deposits, money market UCIs and money market instruments.

Derivatives For hedging and for any other purposes, the Sub-Fund may use financial derivative instruments within the limits and descriptions set out in the prospectus. The use of derivative instrument may increase leverage, imply additional costs and risks.

Benchmark The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The Sub-Fund has no benchmark index and is not managed in reference to a benchmark index

Dividend Policy This Class is cumulative. Dividend distributions are not planned.

Share Class Currency The currency of the Class is USD.

The recommended holding period of this product is determined to allow sufficient time for this product to reach its objectives and avoiding short term market fluctuations.

The return of the product is determined using the Net Asset Value (the "NAV") calculated by FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. (the "Administrative Agent"). This return depends mainly on the market value fluctuations of the underlying investments.

INTENDED RETAIL INVESTOR

The product is suitable for retail investors with limited knowledge of the underlying financial instruments and no financial industry experience. The product is compatible with investors who may bear capital losses and who do not need capital guarantee. The product is compatible with clients looking for growing their capital and who wish to hold their investment over 5 years.

Asset segregation The assets and liabilities of each sub-fund are segregated by law, which means that the performance of the assets in other sub-funds does not influence the performance of your investment.

Dealing The NAV for the Class is calculated on each bank business day in Luxembourg ("Calculation Day") on the basis of the prices of the preceding business day ("Valuation Day"). The cut-off time to submit subscriptions and /or redemption orders is 12 noon at the latest on the relevant Valuation Day.

Switching Shareholders may apply for any shares of any sub-funds to be converted into shares of another sub-fund, provided that the conditions for accessing the target share class, type or sub-type, are fulfilled with respect to the Sub-Fund, on the basis of their respective NAV calculated on the Valuation Day following receipt of the conversion request. The redemption and subscription costs connected with the conversion may be charged to the shareholder as indicated in the prospectus. 

What happens if FundPartner Solutions (Europe) S.A. is unable to pay out?

The Management Company is not making any payment to you in relation to the Sub-Fund and you would still be paid in case of a default from the Management Company.

The Sub-Fund's assets are held with a separate company, the Depositary, so the Sub-Fund's ability to pay out would not be affected by the insolvency of the Management Company. However, in the event of the Depositary's insolvency, or its delegates, the Sub-Fund may suffer a financial loss. However, this risk is mitigated to a certain extent by the fact the Depositary is required by law and regulation to segregate its own assets from the assets of the Sub-Fund. The Depositary will also be liable to the Sub-Fund or its investors for any loss arising from, among other things, its negligence, fraud or intentional failure properly to fulfill its obligations (subject to certain limitations).

If the Sub-Fund is terminated or wound up, the assets will be liquidated and you will receive an appropriate share of any proceeds but you may lose part or all of your investment.

There is no compensation or guarantee scheme protecting you from a default of the Depositary.

What are the costs?

The person advising on or selling you this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.
